## HB2429 Approved by Ways and Means Committee

The House Ways and Means Committee approved HB2429 with a 7 to 0 vote on Monday. Two members were absent. As in the past, support for the bill came from a wide variety of groups. From the utilities to the environmental groups there were comments submitted in favor of the bill. The only negative comments came from a citizen who testified that the bill did not go far enough to support solar in Arizona. The bill goes to the Rules Committee next and then to the floor for a vote. There has been some talk that a cap on the residential side of the credit might be needed for passage. We will be working on that issue as well as a analyzing a Fiscal Note from JLBC that indicated a large price tag for the credit by 2010.

Other good news is that HB2430 (energy cost savings measures, requirements for state facilities) was passed by the House of Representatives by a comfortable 47 to 10 margin yesterday To see how your Representative voted, go to http://www.azleg.gov/FormatDocument.asp?inDoc=/legtext/47leg/2r/bills/hb2430. hthird.1.asp The bill has been transmitted to the Senate.
